What do you Need to do?

- 1) Obtain a Healing Point resident application by calling Starting Point or going to our website.
- 2) Fill out a Healing Point resident application and submit to Starting Point
- 3) A staff member will contact you to set up an interview
- 4) An interview and a screening will be completed to ensure requirements are met to enter the house.

Requirements

- ◆ Ozaukee County Residency
- ◆ Male
- ◆ Treatment, Alternatives, and Diversion (TAD) eligibility and enrollment
- ◆ No criminal history of violence or sex offenses
- ◆ At least 14 days of sobriety



Operations Management

Residents will be provided overlapping levels of supervision through TAD case management, the house manager, and probation if required. There will be an open consent so all parties are able to communicate in the best interest of the resident.

Resident House Manager is responsible for the maintenance of the facility as a household that is safe, sober and recovery supportive, including enforcing rules and providing support and advice to residents

Expectations

Adherence to all house rules as set forth in agreement and as determined by the house manager and case manager; to include random drug testing and absolute sobriety from all substances to maintain housing

Attendance at twelve step meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) or Narcotics Anonymous (NA) and other 12 Step Groups in accordance with Case Manager guidelines

Obtain employment and be responsible for all expenses in accordance with the living agreement
